1. Tools needed are #1 Philips screwdriver minimum 6" blade, 11/32 nut driver, x-acto knife or razor blade and tool provided with unit. See Fig. 1

2. Loosen the two screws on back and remove top cover. See Fig. 2.

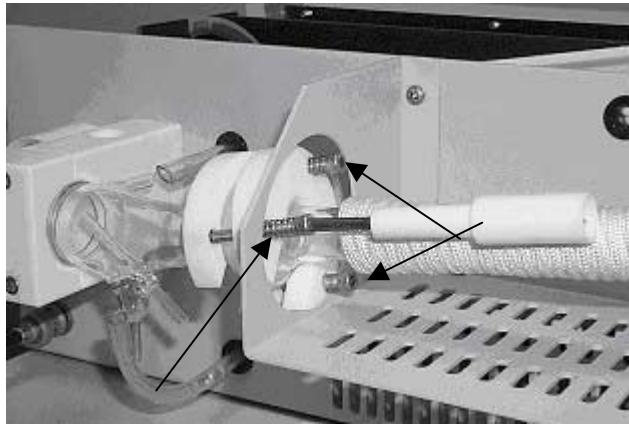

3. Using the tool provided with the unit, remove the three screws holding the two piece clamp. Be careful not to lose the springs. See Fig. 3
4. Remove the clamp. See Fig.4

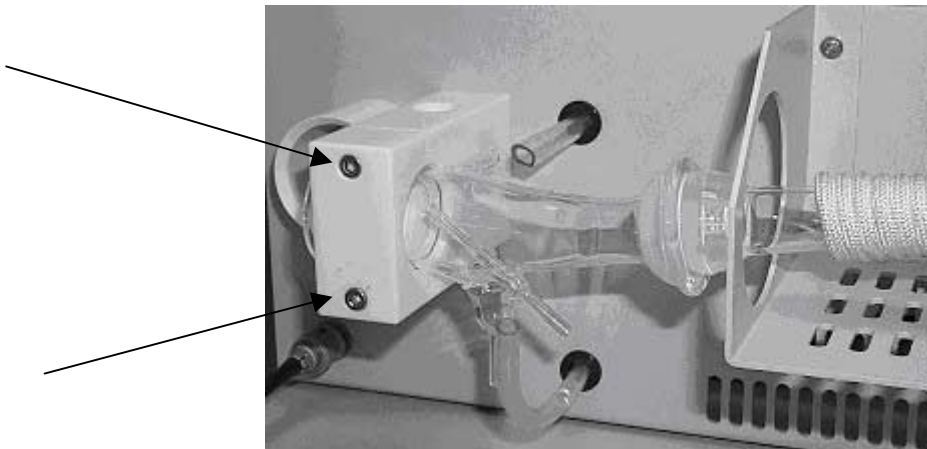

5. Cut the two pieces of tubing from the Aerosol Chamber. See Fig.5

6. Remove the Sample Inlet Adapter by rotating it back and forth. Be careful! This glass is fragile and if broken it will need to be replaced. See Fig. 6

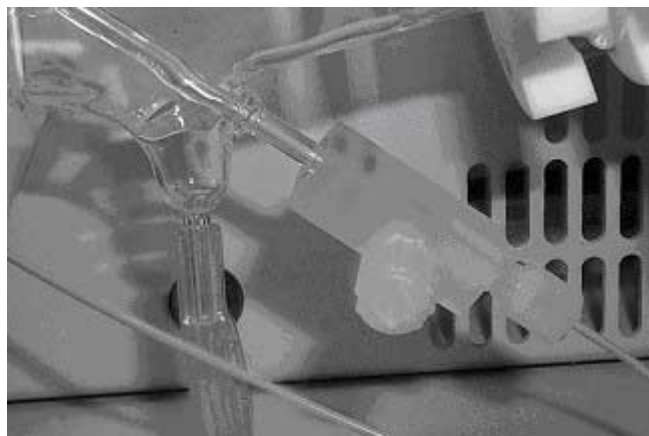

7. Remove the Transducer. See Fig. 7

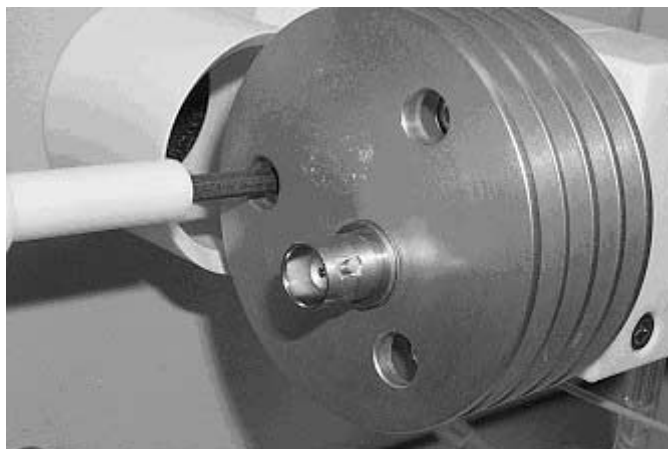

Note: Hold clamp in place while removing screws or glass may drop and break.

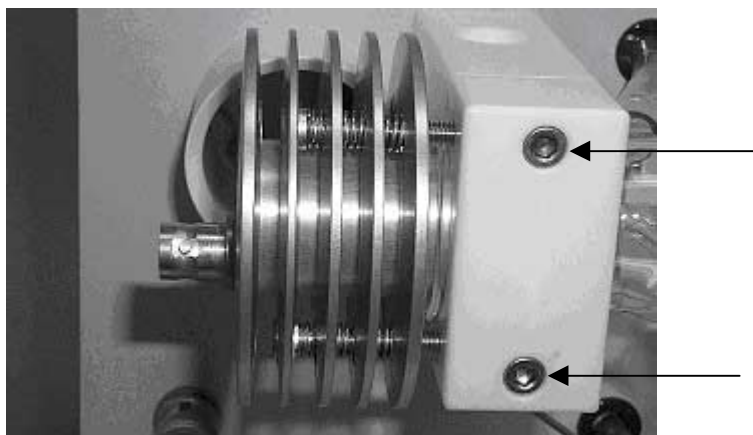
